2011 TOURING PLAYERS' CHAMPIONSHIP: Tristan Curtis, Fife WA, did something at the TPC almost nobody else has done before or since-beat Marshall Kent for a major tournament title. He struck in the 10th frame to defeat Kent for the win, the 5th of his career at the time. He continued on to a berth on the Pac NW all-star team this season. Northwest bowlers swept the top two handicap spots as well, as Vince Bachteler, Oak Harbor WA, defeated Kjerstin Richards for the handicap crown. Tristan and Vince earned \$2,000 prizes, while Richards and Kent banked \$1,000 each.



2011 DESERT OPEN: Phoenix-area bowlers Riley Dempsey and Ryan Zent earned the giant glass cactuses as champions of the 2011 Desert Open, hosted by Glenfair Lanes. In one of our longest formats, bowlers roll 15 qualifying games on three different patterns, followed by matchplay all day on Sunday. Riley beat all-time titles leader Kyle King 194-182 for the scratch title, while Zent topped Lindsey Sanchez 244-208 for the win. Riley's win was especially big: the champs also each got free brackets and raffle tickets all season, which translated into literally hundreds of dollars in additional winnings for Dempsey.



2011 BEST IN THE WEST: In our most unique tournament format, bowlers play 'mini-eliminators', earning points with finalists determined by those points, not pinfall. Kyle King lost in heartbreaking fashion at the 2010 event, and was determined to redeem himself. He did just that, defeating Riley Dempsey in the title match for the 54th title of his JBT career. Steven Acuff beat Zachary Rapp in the handicap division title match for the 7th title of his JBT career, a record in the handicap division. Both bowlers earned \$500 for the wins.



2011 LAS VEGAS MAIN EVENT: In our showcase open-field event, Matt Gasn of Laurel, MD, a star on the east-coast JBT, defeated Main Event veteran Kevin Tatrow, Bel Aire KS, for the Open Scratch Singles title and the \$5,000 first place prize. Valerie Riggin, San Diego, defeated Minnesota's Holly Harris for the Girls Scratch crown, and Brandon Pekins, Torrance CA, beat Brandon Teragawa, San Francisco, for the Handicap Singles championship. Titles were also awarded in scratch and handicap Doubles and Team events, with over \$35,000 awarded to the nationwide field.





2011-12 Season Highlights

The long, 102-event grind of season 16 began in Kirkland, WA, where **Marshall Kent** won title #11 before heading off to college, signaling a change of the guard in the NW, with youngsters like **Tyler Boe** and **Daniel Hanson** breaking through for scratch titles (**Cortez Schenck** and **Wesley Low** also won scratch titles at age 15 or under), while **Tanner Spacey** won three times and topped a close points race for Bowler of the Year. The handicap NW race turned out even closer, as **Max Polhill's** 3rd place finish was just enough to pass fellow Hiline bowler **Kelsey Abrahamsen** for B.O.Y.

Arizona events started just like they finished as **Jakob Butturff** and **Kristen Lee** won on opening weekend at Cliff Castle, and improbably both did it again to wrap up the season in Tempe. Female AZ performances were strong all year, with **Marina Stever** leading the pack with 6 all-conference Women's Series wins, **Kristen Lee** winning all 4 of her women's titles in AZ, and **Jory Koizumi** becoming the first female to win two open scratch titles AND roll a 300 game since the 1998-99 season! **Cameron Smith** held off a late run from **Derek Acuff** to win B.O.Y., while Lee's aforementioned consistency and Invitational runner-up finish easily earned her handicap B.O.Y. Kristen lost that Invite final to 5 year-old **Ashley Lamb**, who became our youngest JBT champion ever with the win (beating older sister Stacey by just 3 days!)- it's not just a slogan, it really is ANY age in JBT!

Close point races were a theme Tour-wide this season, making every shot count at every event, perhaps nowhere more so than in NM-TX handicap, where all eyes were on a close battle between **Jonah Seawright** and **Kory Hetmer**, but in the end **Lindsey Sanchez** snuck by them both for the Invitational win and B.O.Y. Smith was again unstoppable in scratch, sneaking by **Nick Lee** for B.O.Y. #2 on the season.

The Mojave season started with a bang at Red Rock, as **Zack Hattori** fired 268-267-300 for his first three stepladder matches, only to lose to **Jordan Ferrer** 280-278 in the title match! That was about it for high scoring all season long, as lots of tough patterns challenged the bowlers (about 70% of this year's events were on non-house patterns, a record and a trend we will continue). **Alexis Atkin** held off **Joe Gerencser** for the handicap B.O.Y. crown, while Smith did it again, winning the Invite to sew up a third B.O.Y. award this season.

So Cal was invaded by Nor Cal star **Ronnie Fujita**, whose five wins and fashion sense both led the conference. **Austin Thompson** led points much of the season but went winless, until he changed all that in a big way at Parkway, winning the final regular season event and the Invitational to wrap up B.O.Y. **Derek Acuff** had the single game highlight of the year, firing 300 in the Mira Mesa title match, only the second title match perfecto in JBT history. For scratch B.O.Y., it was Cameron's closest call, but he was able to come away with the award, giving him an unprecedented four B.O.Y. awards in one season. He'll add a fifth for all-conference after TPC, while **Alexis Atkin** and **Steven Acuff** will battle it out for handicap all-conference at the TPC. **Marina Stever** has locked up Girls All-Conference Bowler of the Year, while a popular change to the Women's Series allowed for each conference to have Girls Invitationals and Bowlers of the Year as well.

Kyle King's schedule didn't allow for a full JBT schedule, but he still reminded the Tour why he's dominated for so long, winning seven titles Tour-wide including the Tournament of Champions, defeating Smith in a statement title match. **Brendan Lindsey** won the handicap T of C, and having also won the Mojave Invite, this makes him one of the favorites heading into the TPC.

All this leads up to the TPC at Strike Zone - will one of the favorites above take home another major? Or will one of the dozens of talented other qualifiers make their own JBT history? Here we go!
